Childcare in Warner

Boys & Girls Clubs of Central New Hampshire will soon be opening a full time infant and toddler care at the Warner Community Center (49 West Main Street). The center will be called the *Warner Early Learning Center*.

The timeline will depend on staff recruitment. Tuition will be \$300 per week for infants (typically ages 6 wks to about 12 months) and \$275 per week for toddlers (typically about 12 to 36 months). State of New Hampshire Child Care Assistance is accepted. Hours: 7:00 am to 5:30 pm

Pre-enrollment has begun and they will prioritize Warner residents until August 8. Applications will be accepted and processed on a first come, first served basis and a wait list will be created if necessary. You can apply online at https://www.nhyouth.org/location/warner-early-learning-center/. Documents will be requested at some point throughout the application and will need to be uploaded. Library Staff can assist with scanning and uploading if you need help.




