#### **COVID News**

The CDC voted on Saturday June 18 to approve **COVID vaccines for children** between 6 months and 5 years old, and they will be available in NH soon.

Additionally, **Ages 5-11 were recently approved for a Covid-19 booster** vaccine. Map of sites for ages 5-11 and other information are at <a href="https://www.vaccines.nh.gov/">https://www.vaccines.nh.gov/</a>

Warner's new cases *reported*: 4 since last Thursday, as of 6/30/22. Total so far 663. <a href="https://www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#">www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#</a>. Note positive home tests are not included. (Updated every Thursday)

Covid 19 Merrimack County is currently rated as LOW risk by the <u>CDC County Check Tool</u> (based on hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases).




