COVID News

REALM briefing on ventilation

This research briefing, prepared by Battelle, provides the latest research on the effects of ventilation on the spread of COVID-19 that may affect building operations, policies, and procedures, including the following:

- One study suggesting that adding a supply fan into window openings may provide an easy, cost-effective way to improve ventilation.
- A model assessing the use of portable air cleaners (PACs) in reducing COVID-19 infection in poorly ventilated scenarios found that placing PACs in the center of a room provides the optimal location for reducing the risk of infection.
- Several studies examining the use of ultraviolet (UV) technology in minimizing the spread of SARS-CoV-2 in enclosed spaces.

View the briefing

The CDC voted June 18 to approve **COVID vaccines for children** between 6 months and 5 years old, available now at selected locations. Nearest to us are Convenient MD. Additionally, **Ages 5-11 were recently approved for a Covid-19 booster** vaccine. **Maps of sites** for 6 mo. to 5 and ages 5-11 are at https://www.vaccines.nh.gov/

Warner's new cases *reported*: **7** since last Thursday, as of 7/7/22. Total so far 670. www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#. Note positive home tests are not included. (Updated every Thursday)

Covid 19 Merrimack County is currently rated as LOW risk by the <u>CDC County Check</u> Tool (based on **hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases**).

10 of 10 NH Counties including Merrimack are rated LOW risk of Community Transmission this week according to the CDC covid-19 data tracker site

To get a COVID-19 vaccine: <u>vaccines.nh.gov</u> or call 211. You can also schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE, and available for ages 6 mo and up. Second boosters 4+ months after the first, for ages 50+.



Library Meetings


