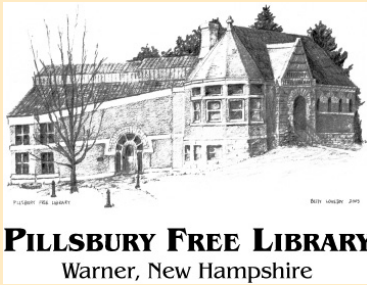

COVID News

COVID vaccines for children between 6 months and 5 years old, available now at selected locations. Nearest to us are Convenient MD.

Additionally, **Ages 5-11 were recently approved for a Covid-19 booster** vaccine.

Warner's new cases reported: 12 since last Thursday, as of 7/14/22. (triple of last week) **Total so far 682.** www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#. Note **positive home tests are not included.** (Updated every Thursday)

Covid 19 Merrimack County is currently rated as LOW risk by the [CDC County Check Tool](#) (based on **hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases**).

9 of 10 NH Counties including Merrimack are **rated LOW** risk of Community Transmission and **Coos County is Medium** risk this week according to the **CDC covid-19 data tracker** site <https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view>:

Warner: 66.9% fully vaccinated, 73% at least one dose.

Merrimack County (CDC) over age 5: 73.6% fully vaccinated, 88.9% at least 1 dose.

To get a COVID-19 vaccine: vaccines.nh.gov. You can also schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE, and available for **ages 6 mo and up**. **Second boosters** 4+ months after the first, for ages 50+.

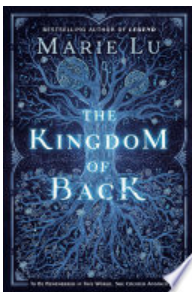

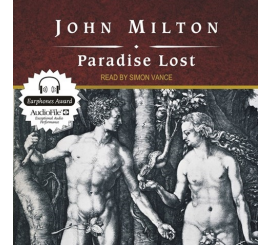

Library Meetings

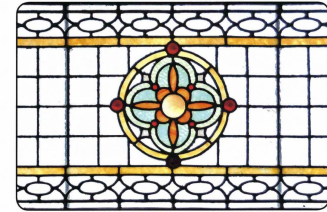
