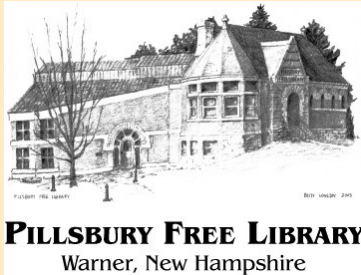

Elections are coming!

For new registrations and make changes to address or name, the Supervisors of the Checklist will meet on **Thursday, September 1** at 7 PM at Warner Town Hall – second floor -If you cannot get to the second floor we will accommodate you (there is also a lift). You **cannot change your party affiliation at this time**.

If you want to register to vote, either at this meeting or at the Town Clerk's Office, bring: Birth Certificate and/or passport; photo ID; and proof of residency in Warner. Your driver's license with a Warner address (not PO Box) can be used for both photo ID and residency. A birth certificate and/or passport is needed to prove citizenship. If you want to register and do not have all the necessary forms, affidavits can be signed, so that you can register.

Waste oil, antifreeze, batteries, fluorescent bulbs - bring to the Transfer Station anytime.

Smoke/CO detectors can be returned to the manufacturer.

NHSaves Button Up Workshop Hosted by Pillsbury Free Library

Pillsbury Free Library, Warner Energy Committee and Warner Connects are hosting this free workshop for residents at The Pillsbury Free Library on Wednesday September 21st at 6:30pm. The workshop will also be available on Zoom. Registration details soon!

The workshop is sponsored by NHSaves and coordinated statewide by the Plymouth Area Renewable Energy Initiative (PAREI).

The NHSaves Button Up Workshop is a 1.5 hour presentation about how to improve the energy efficiency of your home. It is conducted by certified energy auditor Andy Duncan and covers basic building science principles as well as examples of whole house weatherization measures that will button up your home for the heating and cooling seasons. It also covers details about the energy efficiency programs (and funding!) offered by NH utilities (for existing homes and new construction) that provide energy audits, weatherization measures such as air sealing and insulating and rebates on new technologies and products such as electric and gas appliances and high efficiency electric heating/cooling equipment.

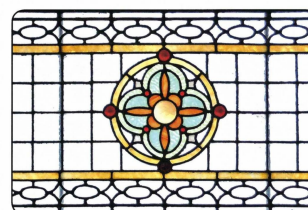
