COVID News

Free COVID and Flu VACCINES! New COVID-19 boosters target the BA.4 and BA.5 Omicron subvariants - available for people aged 12 years and older.. <u>vaccines.nh.gov</u>. (pharmacies that have been doing Vaccines -or schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE.

Expiration dates on some COVID tests have been **extended** - check the updates. Do a Google search by brand. Look again later for extension updates.

Warner's new cases <u>reported</u>: 3 since last Thursday, as of 9/15/22. Total so far 715. <u>www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#</u>. (Updated Thursdays)

Covid 19 Merrimack County and thre other counties' risk rating rose to MEDIUM in the <u>CDC County Check Tool</u> (based on **hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases**). Transmission risk: **CDC covid-19 data tracker** site <u>https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view</u>:

FREE at- home rapid tests are **NO LONGER available** from <u>covidtests.gov/</u> HOWEVER, if you purchase tests and have insurance, ask if you can be reimbursed.

Vaccination rates: <u>NH Towns (WMUR)</u> Warner: 68.4% fully, 75.8% one or more dose. Merrimack County (<u>CDC</u>) over age 5: 75.2% fully vaccinated, 89.4% at least 1 dose.


