COVID News

Free COVID and Flu VACCINES! New COVID-19 boosters target the BA.4 and BA.5

Omicron subvariants - available for people aged 12 years and older.. vaccines.nh.gov. (pharmacies that have been doing Vaccines -or schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE.

Covid Home Test kits: many insurance plans will cover up to 8 tests per month per person. CVS has it set up on their website to order test kits. They can run them through your insurance and then you can pick them up in store.

Expiration dates on some COVID tests have been **extended** - check the updates. Do a Google search by brand. Look again later for extension updates.

Warner's new cases <u>reported</u>: 6 since last Thursday, as of 9/22/22. Total so far 721. www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#. (Updated Thursdays)

Covid 19 Merrimack County and three other counties' risk is still at MEDIUM in the CDC County Check Tool (based on hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases).

None Better: Biographer Robert

For almost 50 years, Robert Caro has written 4 volumes (with a 5th pending) on the life and times of Lyndon Johnson. His achievement is breathtaking: stellar history and a series of riveting novels all rolled into one.

Robert Caro is meticulous. He spends nearly ten years on each volume, reading thousands of documents, conducting innumerable interviews, visiting relevant sites. He even moved to the Texas Hill Country to better understand Lyndon Johnson and his people.

Caro writes slowly. First drafts are handwritten; succeeding drafts are typed on a Corona Electra typewriter before being prepared for modern printing. Robert Caro feels the author needs to interact carefully with each written word, to get the right feeling across to the reader. Caro says, "you can't forget that you're telling a story."

And such powerful stories. You begin on page 1. Suddenly, you're on page 50, and you don't remember turning a 100 years of Hopi Katsina carvings.
