COVID News

Free COVID and Flu VACCINES! New COVID-19 boosters target the BA.4 and BA.5 Omicron subvariants - available for people aged 12 years and older.. vaccines.nh.gov. (pharmacies that have been doing Vaccines -or schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE.

Covid Home Test kits: many insurance plans will cover up to 8 tests per month per person. CVS has it set up on their website to order test kits. Walgreens also is offering help. They run them through your insurance and then you can pick them up in store.

Expiration dates on some COVID tests have been **extended** - check the updates. Do a Google search by brand. Look again later for extension updates.

Warner's new cases <u>reported</u>: 2 since last Thursday, as of 10/05/22. Total so far 727. <u>www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#</u>. (Updated Thursdays) We know of at least 4 cases this week - reported numbers do not reflect all cases.

Merrimack County and three other counties' risk is at MEDIUM in the CDC County Check Tool (based on hospitalizations and deaths, not total cases).


