COVID News

COVID-19-positive hospitalizations in New Hampshire highest in 8 months

FDA authorizes updated COVID-19 booster shots for children as young as 5

Free COVID and Flu VACCINES! New COVID-19 boosters target the BA.4 and BA.5 Omicron subvariants - available for people aged 5 years and older. vaccines.nh.gov. (pharmacies that have been doing Vaccines -or schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE.

Covid Home Test kits: many insurance plans will cover up to 8 tests per month per person. CVS has it set up on their website to order test kits. Walgreens also is offering help. They run them through your insurance and then you can pick them up in store. **Expiration dates on some COVID tests** have been **extended** - check the updates. Do a Google search by brand. Look again later for extension updates.

Warner's new cases <u>reported</u>: 5 since last Thursday, as of 10/12/22. Total so far 732. www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#. (Updated Thursdays) Note that reported numbers do not reflect all cases due to home testing.

Donald Murray was a writer's writer. He won a Pulitzer Prize for Editorial Writing; he was writing coach for the **Boston Globe**; his books on writing process influenced a generation of students and teachers; his classes at the University of New Hampshire were a joy. With his memoir, My Twice-Lived Life, you get to meet Donald Murray.

So, get comfortable, pick up this book of bite-sized chapters (each a good conversation) and visit with Don Murray. Let him share his thoughts with you on getting older, on looking back on life, on appreciating the little things you barely notice.

My Twice-Lived Life starts with Murray's massive heart attack in the late 1980s. He takes you to the hospital, lets you see how he felt and what he experienced. Murray had learned combat readiness on the battlefields of Western Europe during World War II. Now, he was in a different fight, watching for the next heart attack, when "the elephant would again place his foot on my chest and lean down."




