You may be asked to pay over the phone, or send a replacement check. **Watch your statements** to see if the check has been cashed (for the same amount sent) and if so, let Eversource know that. If cashed for a different amount, let your bank know, in case they have been stolen and "washed".

COVID News

COVID-19-positive hospitalizations in New Hampshire highest in 8 months

FDA authorizes updated COVID-19 booster shots for children as young as 5

Free COVID and Flu VACCINES! New COVID-19 boosters target the BA.4 and BA.5 Omicron subvariants - available for people aged 5 years and older. waccines.nh.gov. (pharmacies that have been doing Vaccines -or schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE.

Covid Home Test kits: many insurance plans will cover up to 8 tests per month per person. CVS has it set up on their website to order test kits. Walgreens also is offering help. They run them through your insurance and then you can pick them up in store. **Expiration dates on some COVID tests** have been **extended** - check the updates. Do a Google search by brand. Look again later for extension updates.

Warner's new cases-<u>reported</u>: 2 since last Thursday, as of 11/03/22. Total so far 739. www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#. (Updated Thursdays) Note that reported numbers do not reflect all cases due to home testing.

Merrimack County and all but two other counties' risk is at MEDIUM in the <u>CDC County Check Tool</u>, and two are <u>Low</u> this week as cases rise (based on **hospitalizations as well as case rates per 100,000**). 
