In and Around Warner

Warner Town Offices and Departments, U.S. Post Office and Sugar River Bank, and Kearsarge Regional Schools will be **closed** on Friday, **November 11**, 2022 in observance of **Veterans Day**.

Election results: The results of the November 8, 2022 voting can be <u>downloaded here</u> or at <u>warner.nh.us</u>. **1,589 Warner people voted** and 107 new registrations were completed on Voting Day, bringing the total number of registered voters to approximately 2200.

The Town Moderator, Town Clerk and other Election officials wish to thank all voters for their patience and courtesy which made a very busy voting day go very smoothly. Thank you also to the 40 volunteer ballot counters who were finished in just 2 1/2 hours.

The **Library held a contest** on Voting Day to guess how many books are in the library. The 41 guesses ranged from 745 to 1,631,361! The guess nearest to the actual number of 28,846 (as of 12/31/21) was amazingly close at 28,271, submitted by David Pook. Congratulations!

COVID-19-positive hospitalizations in New Hampshire highest in 8 months

FDA authorizes updated COVID-19 booster shots for children as young as 5

Free COVID and Flu VACCINES! New COVID-19 boosters target the BA.4 and BA.5 Omicron subvariants - available for people aged 5 years and older. <u>vaccines.nh.gov</u>. (pharmacies that have been doing Vaccines -or schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE.

Covid Home Test kits: many insurance plans will cover up to 8 tests per month per person. CVS has it set up on their website to order test kits. Walgreens also is offering help. They run them through your insurance and then you can pick them up in store. **Expiration dates on some COVID tests** have been **extended** - check the updates. Do a Google search by brand. Look again later for extension updates.

Warner's new cases-<u>reported</u>: 1 since last Thursday, as of 11/10/22. Total so far 740. <u>www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#</u>. (Updated Thursdays) Note that reported numbers do not reflect all cases due to home testing.


