## **Library Gratitude**

#### We have a lot to be thankful for this year at the library!

Grants received in 2021 enabled us to improve services in 2022; two **privacy booths** were purchased with ARPA funds, and a NH Charitable Fund Library Technology grant enabled us to update **computers, get a ceiling mounted projector and conferencing OWL** for the Frank Maria Meeting Room, and other technology improvements.

Thanks to a vote in favor of **library building capital funding** at 2022 Town Meeting, a new **energy efficient heating and cooling system** was installed in the library this month.

Funds raised with our **2021 Annual Fund Drive, events assisted by the Circle of Friends,** and other private donations enabled us to pay for shipping and installation of the **Privacy booths,** purchase **STEM activity kits** for the Children's collection, and pay for some minor remodeling and patching after the HVAC installation.

Most importantly for some, donations mean we are also able to **continue this Newsletter** (the annual Constant Contact subscription) and to provide weekly printed nine-page copies to about 40 people who have no access to email.

We are also thankful for all our visitors and townspeople who make our work worthwhile and for those who contribute news for this newsletter!

And let's not forget to thank the **Department of Public Works** employees who maintain the lawns all summer, remove leaves in fall, and clear the walkways in winter!

### **COVID News**

Free COVID and Flu VACCINES! New COVID-19 boosters target the BA.4 and BA.5 Omicron subvariants - available for people aged 5 years and older. <u>vaccines.nh.gov</u>. (pharmacies that have been doing Vaccines -or schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccinations for Covid-19 are FREE. FDA authorizes updated COVID-19 booster shots for children as young as 5

**Covid Home Test kits**: many insurance plans will cover up to 8 tests per month per person. CVS has it set up on their website to order test kits. Walgreens also is offering help. They run them through your insurance and then you can pick them up in store. **Expiration dates on some COVID tests** have been **extended** - check the updates. Do a Google search by brand. Look again later for extension updates.

Warner's new cases <u>reported</u>: 1-<u>since last Thursday</u>, as of 11/17/22. Total so far 741. <u>www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#</u>. (Updated Thursdays) Note that reported numbers do not reflect all cases due to home testing.

Merrimack County and three other counties' risk is at MEDIUM in the <u>CDC County Check</u> <u>Tool</u>, and six are Low this week as cases rise (based on hospitalizations as well as case rates per 100,000). 
