### **COVID News**

FDA authorizes updated COVID-19 booster shots for children as young as 5

Free COVID and Flu VACCINES! New COVID-19 boosters target the BA.4 and BA.5 Omicron subvariants - available for people aged 5 years and older. <a href="mailto:vaccines.nh.gov">vaccines.nh.gov</a>. (pharmacies that have been doing Vaccines -or schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccines for Covid-19 are FREE.

**Covid Home Test kits**: many insurance plans will cover up to 8 tests per month per person. CVS has it set up on their website to order test kits. Walgreens also is offering help. They run them through your insurance and then you can pick them up in store. **Expiration dates on some COVID tests** have been **extended** - check the updates. Do a Google search by brand. Look again later for extension updates.

Warner's new cases-<u>reported</u>: 3 since Thursday 12/1/22, as of 12/8/22. Total so far 747. <a href="https://www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#">www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#</a>. (Updated Thursdays) Note that reported numbers do not reflect all cases due to home testing.

Merrimack County and all other NH counties' risk is at LOW in the CDC County Check Tool, this week (based on hospitalizations as well as case rates per 100,000). Transmission risk source: CDC covid-19 data tracker site <a href="https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view">https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view</a>. However, Flu is spreading so masking may still be wise!

Planning ahead for the winter holiday school break/vacation. Miss Sue will have many games/manipulatives and a larger selection of legos readily available to keep the




