COVID News

FDA authorizes updated COVID-19 booster shots for children as young as 5

Free COVID and Flu VACCINES! New COVID-19 boosters target the BA.4 and BA.5 Omicron subvariants - available for people aged 5 years and older. vaccines.nh.gov. (pharmacies that have been doing Vaccines -or schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccines for Covid-19 are FREE.

Covid Home Test kits: many insurance plans will cover up to 8 tests per month per person. CVS has it set up on their website to order test kits. Walgreens also is offering help. They run them through your insurance and then you can pick them up in store. **Expiration dates on some COVID tests** have been **extended** - check the updates. Do a Google search by brand. Look again later for extension updates.

Warner's new cases-<u>reported</u>: 2 since Thursday 12/8/22, as of 12/15/22. Total so far 749. www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#. (Updated Thursdays) Note that reported numbers do not reflect all cases due to home testing.

Merrimack County and all other NH counties' risk is at LOW in the CDC County Check Tool, this week (based on hospitalizations as well as case rates per 100,000). Transmission risk source: CDC covid-19 data tracker site https://covid.cdc.gov/covid-data-tracker/#county-view. However, Flu is spreading so masking may still be wise!

The Forever Presence of a Talented Man: Edward Herrmann by Roger Robbins

Edward Herrmann seemed to be everywhere doing everything well: theater; the small screen; major motion pictures. He was an imposing actor at 6'5", as friendly and as charming as he was large.

To a generation of Americans, Edward Herrmann was Franklin Roosevelt. His performance as FDR in Eleanor and Franklin: The Early Years and in The White House Years won him 2 Best Actor Emmy nominations. He reprised the role of FDR in Annie and for the Ken Burns' production The Roosevelts: An Intimate History.

Edward Herrmann had "A Voice". He recorded audiobooks (winner of an "Audie" award), <u>for adults</u> and <u>for children</u>. His last work was narration for Ken Burns' <u>Cancer: The Emperor of All Maladies</u>. Edward



Library Meetings


