Tax Forms: We expect 2022 IRS Form 1040, Form 1040 SR, and Inst. 1040, around mid-January of 2023. We can also print other forms from IRS.gov for anyone who needs them, when available.

Reminder: Property taxes are due by December 27. The Tax collector's hours are Mon. – Thurs. 9 -3, but the office will be closed Monday Dec. 26. Mailed payments postmarked by Dec. 27 count as on time, and there is a "mail slot" in the wooden front door of Town Hall for hand deliveries during closed hours. Free COVID and Flu VACCINES! New COVID-19 boosters target the BA.4 and BA.5 Omicron subvariants - available for people aged 5 years and older. vaccines.nh.gov. (pharmacies that have been doing Vaccines -or schedule a vaccine through your doctor's office. Vaccines for Covid-19 are FREE.

Warner's new cases-<u>reported</u>: **7 since Thursday 12/15/22**, as of 12/22/22. **Total so far 756**. <u>www.wmur.com/article/covid-19-cases-nh-town/37155089#</u>. (Updated Thursdays) Note that reported numbers do not reflect all cases due to home testing.

Merrimack County and all other NH counties' risk except Rockingham is at LOW this week (based on hospitalizations as well as case rates per 100,000). 

Library Meetings


