## It's That Time of Year!



The Pillsbury Free Library's **Grow-It-Yourself workshop** series kicks off on **Wednesday March 1 at 6:30 pm** with **Seed Starting and propagation** by Master Gardener Sarah Marcoux. The presentation can be viewed at home on Zoom or you can come to the Library's meeting room and view it on a projector screen. Free.

Learn the benefits and best practices for **starting plants** 

**from seeds and cuttings.** How to get started, successful germination requirements, different growing methods and mediums, light and temperature requirements, overcoming common problems, hardening off seedlings for transplanting into the garden, and best practices to ensure seedlings successfully grow into healthy mature plants. 


