The Pillsbury Free Library is hosting a **Well Water Testing Informational Workshop Wed. March 29**, **2023 at 6:00 pm.** Presented by the NH Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) in the library's meeting room and also on Zoom, the workshop will cover why well users should get their water tested; the most common contaminants and

associated health risks; how to test your water; what your test results mean, and water treatment options.

Water test kits with forms will be available for pickup at the library during the event, as well as Thurs. March 30 and Sat. April 1 for those unable to attend but who still want to have their well water tested.

As an added convenience, private well owners who have collected well water samples may drop off their water samples to a Library Trustee on the porch of Cafe One East on Sunday, April 2, between 1 and 3 PM, with the completed test forms and a check to NHDES for the testing requested. The samples will be delivered to the lab in Concord the next morning for testing. You can also deliver your test kit to NH DES yourself. Results are later mailed directly to you.

# **Tech Tips: Scam emails**

**Scam tip from Dan Watts**: Beware phishing emails purporting to be voicemail message notifications. An example **Subject**: *VM Message Transcribed on February 14, 2023*. The included attachment was an HTML file that contained code to attempt to hack the recipient. NEVER open HTML attachments. NEVER open any attachments you were not expecting to receive. Even if you think the attachment is something you were expecting, look closely at the email headers to determine if it really came from the sender you think it came from (often you can hover the mouse over the sender to see the REAL address).

**Audiobooks:** A collection in the library; many more titles available through inter-library loan; <u>downloads</u> from Overdrive.




