Presented by the NH Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) in the library's meeting room and also on Zoom, the workshop will cover why well users should get their water tested; the most common contaminants and associated health risks; how to test your water; what your test results mean, and water treatment options.

Water test kits with forms will be available for pickup at the library during the event, as well as Sat. April 1 for those unable to attend. Well owners who have collected well water samples may drop off their water samples to a Library Trustee on the porch of Cafe One East on Sunday, April 2, between 1 and 3 PM, with the completed test forms and a check to NHDES.

Literary World-Beater of 1922 by Roger Robbins

In 1922, the literary field brimmed with excellence: Scott Fitzgerald and James Joyce and T.S. Eliot and Virginia Woolf - and Arthur Stuart-Menteth (A.S.M.) Hutchinson.

A.S.M. Hutchinson, a British writer born in India, wrote If Winter Comes, the bestselling novel of 1922. It sold over 350,000 copies, was made into plays in London, on Broadway, and in Sydney. In 1923, If Winter Comes was turned into a movie; in 1947, a second film production was released.

If Winter Comes is the story of Mark Sabre, a decent, troubled man in a small English village at the time of World War I. It is filled with humor and joy, with pain and loss. A satisfying journey back in time with a glorious, nearly forgotten story.

If Winter Comes can be obtained through inter-library loan, or downloaded for free through <u>Amazon</u> or from the <u>Gutenberg Project</u>.





Library Meetings


