The Pillsbury Free Library TONIGHT! Well Water Testing Informational Workshop THURS. March 30, 2023 at 6:00 pm. Presented by the NH Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) in the library's meeting room and also on Zoom, the workshop will cover why well users should get their water tested; the most common contaminants and associated health risks; how to test your water; what your test results mean, and water treatment options. This is being recorded so you can **ask us for a link to view it**. Water test kits with forms will be available for pickup at the library during the event, as well as **Sat. April 1** and later for those unable to attend. Well owners who have collected well water samples **may drop off their water samples to a Library Trustee on the porch of Cafe One East on Sunday, April 2, between 1 and 3 PM**, with the completed test forms and a check to NHDES.

Helping Hands

The Food Pantry at 49 E. Main Street is open Monday to Thursday from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Having a "shopping list" in mind when you arrive will help our volunteers put your orders together more quickly. Also, keep in mind that fresh produce is offered each week (check out the list on the whiteboard inside the tent opening). Pet food is available, too. The Food Pantry volunteers look forward to seeing you!

Housing Assistance - Renter and homeowner assistance programs are available at https://homehelpnh.org/. Both programs are limited by available resources depending on utilization by renters and owners. People can also call 2-1-1, particularly if they don't have Internet access. For homeowners, the program provides up to \$20,000 per household for delinquencies related to mortgages, utilities, property taxes, and other housing related costs. The property must be owner-occupied and must be the owner's primary residence.

Need help finding forms or uploading documents? Stop in the library! Scanning and emailing is free. Printed pages are 10 cents but we can waive that in cases of need. For online interviews or telehealth appointments, two privacy booths and laptop computers are available.
