White Plains Rd Closure - Per the <u>Town of Webster</u>: The culvert on White Plains Road over Knights Brooks is being replaced. The road will be **closed from Monday, April 24th, 2023 at 7 a.m. through Saturday, April 29th, 2023 at 6 p.m.** If the project is completed before that time the road will be opened. Please plan an alternative route during this time. Schoodac Rd becomes White Plains Rd upon entering Webster.

A public hearing has been set to discuss the proposal to replace the existing Red List bridge carrying NH 127 over the Warner River. The project includes improvements to the intersection of NH 127 and Dustin Road located just north of the bridge and ancillary roadway work. This project may impact historical properties.

The hearing will be held at WARNER TOWN HALL, 5 EAST MAIN STREET, WARNER, NH on THURSDAY, APRIL 27, 2023 at 6:00 P.M.

Need help finding forms, printing or uploading documents? Stop into the library! Scanning and emailing is free. Printed pages are 10 cents but we can waive that in cases of need. For online interviews or telehealth appointments, two privacy booths and laptop computers are available.

Volunteers and the **United Church of Warner** are hosting a **fundraising pancake breakfast on April 22**, **2023** from 7:30 – 11 a.m. **for the town of Rolling Fork**, **Mississippi**, a town of almost 1900 people devastated on March 24, 2023 when an EF4

tornado ripped through town killing sixteen people and injuring many more. Pancakes, waffles, home fries, baked beans, sausage and beverages. \$12 for adults, children 7 – 12 \$5, and six and under free. If you can't attend but would like to donate, send a check to the United Church of Warner, PO Box 203, Warner, 03278 labelled as for Rolling Fork.

There are still some **well water sampling test kits** available at the library for sampling your own well water for submission to NH DES (drop off in Concord).

PFAS Removal Rebate Program for Private Wells

The NHDES PFAS Removal Rebate Program for Private Wells is accepting applications. This one-time rebate is available for single or multi-use residential properties with a private well that have an exceedance of one or more of the four NHDES Ambient Groundwater Quality Standards (AGQS) for per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) and have not been offered an alternate water source (bottled water, treatment, or service connection) from a third party. Eligible applicants may be provided a rebate for up to \$5,000 for the installation of PFAS treatment (point-of-use or point-of-entry) or up to \$10,000 for a service connection to a public water system.


