There are still some **well water sampling test kits** available at the library for sampling your own well water for submission to NH DES (drop off in Concord).

Bradford PD is alerting people about a scam email where users are notified that "Paypal has detected a fraudulent use of their account and for security reasons, the purchase was denied". Users are asked to call into a phone number listed for more information on the transaction. This is a SCAM and the number does not go to PayPal. This group, if you call, will even provide paperwork from your local bank making it all seem real. It is NOT. Do not send them money to offset the transaction while they work to get your money back. It never left in the first place. You can easily log into your account and see messages sent from PayPal. You will NOT have one about this because it's a SCAM.
