Why Compost? In 2018, approximately 146.1 million tons of Municipal Solid Wastes were landfilled, nationwide, with food being the largest component at about 24% and yard waste at about 7%, according to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The use of backyard composting systems by residents can help divert this waste, while benefiting from fresh compost. 


The next and LAST After School Craft of the school year is Tuesday May 16th, 3-4:00. Please reserve a space for your child.

NEW: End of the Federal COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE) Declaration Testing, vaccines etc. after May 11: COVID-19 at-home tests may not be covered by insurance because Insurance providers will no longer be required to waive costs or

provide free COVID-19 tests. Use CDC's <u>No Cost COVID-19 Testing Locator</u> https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/end-of-phe.html

FREE At-Home Covid-19 Test Kits can be picked up at the Library, and at Town Hall, courtesy of NH DHHS. Tests are good until October 2023. For businesses and non-profits, or parents who want youth size masks, ask us for **boxes of masks**.
