Ticked Off! by Roger Robbins

On your nose; between your toes; or sitting in the sink; inside or outside, it's tough to avoid them, they're quicker than you think. Ticks!

Ticks are not only annoying, they're dangerous. Pillsbury Free Library has books on Ticks and Lyme Disease to inform you. Titles include <u>Cure</u> <u>Unknown: Inside the Lyme Epidemic</u> (Weintraub); <u>Preventing Lyme &</u> <u>Other Tick-Borne Diseases</u> (Chesney); <u>Natural Treatments for</u> <u>Lyme Coinfections (Buhner)</u>; and <u>Beating Lyme (Bean)</u>. In addition, Warner author **Dana Myskowski** has written a novel (<u>I Cannot Play With You</u>) that treats on the topic of chronic Lyme.


