places due to recent heavy rains. Conservation Officers utilized ATVs to get her back to Bound Tree Road in Hopkinton.





Free Kanopy Streaming Movies

Although we have <u>over 2500 DVDs</u> to borrow, including the new **Dungeons & dragons**, **Inspector Lewis #8, Tulsa King, Season 1, and The Super Mario Bros. movie**, we know many of you don't have a DVD player so you may want to try our **free streaming film** service at https://warnernh.Kanopy.com. (these are not downloads, so they need wifi or data use).

The Kanopy collection includes BBC series like *Father Brown*, and classics like *Dorian Grey* and old Oscar winners, as well as contemporary small-studio productions. Set up your personal warnernh.kanopy.com account **using your library card** number and your email account so that you can return to the film up to 3 times to finish watching it. You can also sign up for email news alerts of new titles added. There is also an app.

Please note that each time you play 90 secs+ of a Kanopy film it is counted as a full play that the library pays for, so please read the descriptions carefully when trying to decide on your next film to view! (Exception is items in the kids section - we only pay one small fee for 30 days of kids' viewings. There are also some "fee free" titles each month.)

And about those DVDs...our loan period for DVDs (and book) is a generous **21 days**, and we do have a portable DVD player that can be borrowed.

Free Downloadable Books and Magazines

Do you love to read/ listen but need to pack light for traveling, or are too busy to visit the library to borrow books?

Use the **Libby for OverDrive** app on your phone, tablet or other device to download one of the 20,000+ **free** ebook, audio book, and thousands of magazines available to read onthe-go. Finished what you brought/ downloaded? Simply find an Internet connection and download something new! Have limited storage but free wifi? Stream it. You will need your library card number and password to get started - call 603-456-2289.

if your device cannot use the Libby app, go to https://libbyapp.com to sign in and download books, or try https://nh.overdrive.com if you are sharing a device with others.

OverDrive AUDIO BOOK data use tip: make sure your settings in the Libby app allow you to download the audio book in advance of travel, or it may be streaming live using your cell data - and it will stop working when you lose cell connection. Same for ebooks.

Please do us the following budget favors to increase the availability of more titles:

- When selecting magazines (or books) from OverDrive/ Libby, try previewing the sample and reading the table of contents for any issue before hitting "borrow" just to be sure you will actually read it. Our cost for magazines is based on total downloads.
- 2. When browsing ebooks and audiobooks for ideas, instead of placing HOLDS on titles you MIGHT want to read in future, consider TAGGING instead and selecting it later for a true hold when you are certain. The consortium purchases/rents extra "copies" when the holds list gets too long, and this reduces the funds available for purchase of new titles (some titles are VERY costly, and leases are for 26 loans).
