Kearsarge Indian Museum's *Nebizun: Water is Life* exhibit: indigenous/Abenaki viewpoints on the use and caretaking of water inform this exhibit which uses artwork, informational panels, and activities to teach about the importance of clean water to all our communities. Inspired by a group of Wabanaki grandmothers who undertook an 857-kilometer spiritual journey, walking from the Sipekne'katik River in Nova Scotia to the Penobscot River at Nebezin, in Passadumkeag, Maine, this exhibit aims to inspire everyone to be a "water protector" and see water as more than a natural resource.

The **Warner Historical Society**'s summer exhibit uses **the village of Davisville** as a microcosm to explore the history of settlement, industry, education, tourism, transportation, and the history of Native Americans and Black Americans living in Warner. The exhibit features the artwork of Fernanda and Giselle Harrington from their publication *Lost Davisville: Forgotten New Hampshire History*.
