Set up your personal warnernh.kanopy.com account using your library card number and your email account so that you can return to the film up to 3 times to finish watching it. You can also sign up for email news alerts of new titles added. There is also a Kanopy app.

Please note that each time you play 90 secs+ of a Kanopy film it is counted as a full play that the library pays for, so please read the descriptions carefully when trying to decide on your next film to view! (Exception is items in the kids section - we only pay one small fee for 30 days of kids' viewings. There are also some "fee free" titles each month.)

# Downloadable Books - for kids, too

Did you know the free NH Downloadable Books include titles for children? There are even read-alongs that narrate each page as the child "turns" the page of the ebook. Take a look at some **HERE**. Or try audio books to go along with a print copy.

Don't want to download, because of limited space on your device, but have wifi access? Choose the Overdrive Read format to live stream in your internet browser (Chrome, Edge, Firefox, etc). Search at https://nh.overDrive.com or using the Libby by OverDrive app on your phone, tablet or other device. If your device cannot use the Libby app, go to https://libbyapp.com to sign in and download books, or try https://nh.overdrive.com if you are sharing a device with others.

**OverDrive AUDIO BOOK data use tip**: make sure your settings in the Libby app allow you to download the audio book in advance of travel, or it may be streaming live using your cell data - and it will stop working when you lose cell connection. Same for ebooks.

Did you know that the Library staff can assist you with **printing, scanning, and emailing** documents? You can even email them to us to print, and pick them up later - just call 603-456-2289. Ten cents per printed page for black and white, 50 cents for color. **Are you nervous about using computers** but need to fill out an application online or upload a document? Library staff can help!

#### Private space for online meetings, for personal or business needs, tutors, or phone calls in the library!

In May 2022 we were able to purchase two Poppin Pod **privacy booths** thanks to an ARPA grant via the NH State Library and IMLS (Institute for Museums and Library Services). They have been very popular. These booths have lighting, power outlets, and ventilation fans. They muffle sound in both directions to give more privacy.
