COVID News

There is an increasing (now 13%) uptick in Covid cases nationally and we are seeing more cases locally. Covid Tests are jumping off our freebie shelf! There are also Colds going around. **If you have symptoms, test again** after 48 hrs if negative but still symptomatic. If you know you were exposed, best testing time is day 5. Some have reported **nausea** with the newest strain.

Newly formulated COVID-19 vaccines are slated to be released in the fall. Alice Peck Day Memorial Hospital at Dartmouth began requiring employees to wear masks again August 1, amid an increase in COVID-19 infections.

FREE At-Home Covid-19 Test Kits can be picked up **at the Library**, and at Town Hall, courtesy of NH DHHS. Test kit validity dates <u>have been extended</u> to **February 2024.** For businesses and non-profits, or parents who want youth size masks, ask us for **boxes of masks**.
