The movie will be followed by Q&A with Lyme-Literate Physician **Dr. Lynn Durand** and Tick-Borne Disease Ecologist and Patient Advocate **Kathie Fife.**

"THE QUIET EPIDEMIC follows a young girl from Brooklyn and a Duke University scientist both diagnosed with a disease said to not exist: Chronic Lyme disease. 
