Participate in the Town's Hazard Mitigation Committee meetings to update the 2019 Warner Hazard Mitigation Plan, held remotely via Zoom Webinar and at the Warner EOC, 148 West Main St on Wednesdays, starting September 27, 2023, from 9:30-11:30 AM (Zoom login below). Every 5 years, the Haz Mit Plan must be updated and approved to ensure the Town's continued eligibility for federal disaster recovery and mitigation grant project funding.

The Committee will review recent past and potential natural disasters, severe weather and other hazard events. Existing mitigation capabilities, critical facilities, vulnerable areas and populations will be identified. The Committee will review and develop long-term risk reduction mitigation actions. 
