Parking: Saturday and Sunday, Off site parking at Nichols field will be provided until 6 PM on both days. A shuttle bus will run every 15 mins, at NO charge for the bus ride. **Parking is \$10** per vehicle, in designated lots. Consider it a donation for all the good

events and to benefit Warner activities! There are NO admission fees to ANY of the events or shows such as the oxen pull and woodsman's contest, or music at the MainStreet Warner Stage.

HANDICAP PARKING; on Saturday, one of the lots at the Mentis Sciences building (formerly Warner Power) will be for handicap parking. A Board member will transport handicap attendees up to Main St. in a golf cart starting at 8:30am, last run at 6:30pm.

Parking for handicap is allowed at the Post Office and Sugar River Bank AFTER 12pm only on Saturday. **All Handicap parkers must have a license plate or tag to use the handicap lots.**

SUNDAY: There will be handicap parking all day at Sugar River Bank and NOT at Mentis Science. At the Post Office, handicap parking is available AFTER 10 AM Sunday (When the Fun Run is over). There will not be anyone to transport on Sunday.

You can order **one set of #4 free at-home** individual rapid antigen COVID-19 tests again. Limit of one order per residential address. Orders will ship free starting October 2, 2023. https://special.usps.com/testkits. Tests may show "expired" dates on the box, but **FDA has extended those dates**; see the full list of extended expiration dates
