<u>WE ARE ALL OUT OF</u> At-Home Covid-19 Test Kits at the Library. DHHS needs their stock for Nursing homes which are testing often to control recent outbreaks. **HOWEVER**, businesses or non-profits, or families for youth size masks, ask us for **boxes of masks**.

The library has three **well water test sampling kits** that can be used to send water samples to NH DES for testing. Ask staff.


