Ever have a book stalk you? Have it jump up and stare you down? I have: The Storied Life of A. J. Fikry by Gabrielle Zevin.

At the library service desk, I check it out; I check it in. I shelve it. Fikry even popped up in a library display. I passed that book 20 times a day. And it always sat there, eyeballing me.

To top if off, I looked for a movie to watch on Amazon. Highlighted new offering? You guessed it - The Storied Life of A. J. Fikry (starring Kunal Nayyar - "Raj" from The Big Bang Theory; Lucy Hale; and David Arquette).

To break the "Fikry Hex", I made a bold move: I read the book.

A. J. Fikry, it turns out, had a very "storied life". He was owner of a bookstore on the fictional Alice Island, near Hyannis. Fikry has known much sadness, but with the arrival of bookseller Amelia Loman, his life begins to turn round. And Fate drops a "bundle" in his lap.. Spoiler alert: Maya is a delight.

Lots of memorable characters, and plenty of talk about authors and books. (catnip for a librarian). There is even a mystery with the theft of A. J.'s prized possession: an early edition Edgar Allan Poe.

Fikry and I are now friends. But, there is this other book, <u>The Librarianist</u>, by Patrick Dewitt, that suddenly seems to be everywhere I look!




