Another change is coming to our **Kanopy** Movie service: you will soon be asked to change over to a new sign in method using your Library card number and passcode, the same one you can use for downloadable books and magazines, or for reserving items in our catalog. The transition will happen during the next month. If you don't know your passcode, contact library staff to update it. https://warnernh.kanopy.com

Starting November 1, each user is assigned a set maximum number of free "tickets" - currently 30 - per month, and each film info page states how many tickets it will use and how many hours or days you will be given to finish viewing it. Longer films and TV seasons will use more tickets and allow more days to view. The library is invoiced \$1 per ticket used.

Kanopy Kids is Kanopy's curated collection of content for children, with a focus on ages 2-8 and you can set parental controls to block their access to other sections so they only see age-appropriate content, and it allows unlimited free (no-ticket) kids viewing. More at help.kanopy.com/en-us




