Volunteers are needed for **Stream Monitoring** in the Warner River Watershed On **Wed. Jan. 3 at 7:00 pm** in the Town Hall the Warner Conservation Commission will briefly review **brook trout conservation projects and stream surveys** in the Warner River Watershed, for potential volunteers. Over 10 years of survey results indicate high water quality and a healthy population of wild brook trout. Future monitoring of selected streams in the watershed (including Ballard Brook, Bartlett Brook, and Willow Brook) are essential to assess the impacts on the watershed of climate change and development, for example. **Future stream monitoring will depend on volunteers** focused on **macroinvertebrate** surveys and **water quality testing**. Training sessions will be scheduled and equipment will be supplied by the Basil Woods Jr. Chapter of Trout Unlimited.


Wishing everyone HAPPY HOLIDAYS! Looking for things to do over vacation? The library is open for books, games, and
