Copier/ printer fees: In order to cover the increasing cost of paper, ink, and copier

maintenance, the Library Board of Trustees has approved an increase in what the library charges per page of printing. **Starting January 2024**, **black and white copies will be 20 cents/ page**, and full color pages \$1. (This is our first increase since the 1980s!).

# **Library Passes and Other Resources!**

### **Featured Service of the week**

Tech tips for using digital books from <a href="https://nh.overdrive.com/">https://nh.overdrive.com/</a> that help keep Library dollars effective!

How this service is funded, and how the publisher rules are killing our budgets:

In NH, libraries have grouped funds to provide digital books from <u>OverDrive</u> (also accessed via the **Libby app**).

### Library costs for digital titles:

- 1. Many titles are **leased** items that need to be renewed (purchased) after every 26 loans.
- 2. A renewal counts as an additional loan (so it uses up "lease" numbers)
- 3. Each license costs library systems FAR more than a private buyer would be charged. (\$80-120 for some).
- 4. Too many holds on one title will trigger purchase of an additional license that might not be needed if people can be patient.

# How you can help keep costs down so we can purchase more for your

- 1. Don't check out more than you can read in the allotted time, because a renewal counts as a loan.
- 2. If a hold comes available but you won't be able to finish it before expiration, <u>DEFER the checkout</u> and be next in line.
- 3. If you can wait a little, use a <u>tag</u> like "read later" instead of a hold, and try again later. THANKS!



# **Health and Helping Hands**

Have you signed up for **NH Alerts**? If not, go to <u>ReadyNH.gov</u> to enroll in the free NH Alerts emergency notification system.

If you are enrolled and got a text notifying you that New Hampshire is transitioning to a new emergency notification system, **This was a LEGITIMATE text message** – the State of New Hampshire has selected Genasys as the next provider for emergency notifications. You can register or update your information at the new registration portal:

https://stateofnewhampshire.genasys.com/portal

Residents and visitors **who were enrolled to receive alerts** by email, text message or on a cellphone or landline in CodeRED, before September 26, 2023, **will automatically be added** into the new system.
