Voting and Legislation

Tuesday, February 6, 2024 is the last day for 25 or more registered voters or 2% of the registered voters, whichever is less, to submit to the Select Board any **petition to include** as a warrant article (NH RSA 39:3.)

The Warner Budget Committee will be holding a final **public hearing** on financial warrant articles on Tuesday February 6, and a final vote on Thursday February 8.

The Town of Warner is proposing changes to the **Warner Zoning Ordinance**, Article XV, Non-Conforming Use. These changes will be voted on at **Town Meeting on March 13**, 2024. A bill aimed at saving the **NH Organic Farming certification** program, **House Bill 1184**, would send an additional \$220,000 to the state Department of Agriculture, Markets and Food for the organic certification program. That would cover the creation of one full-time and one part-time inspector, positions that Commissioner Shawn Jasper has said are necessary to keep the program running.

The second, **House Bill 1618**, would require the state to continue certifying organic farmers by turning what is now an optional program into a mandatory one.

Fireflies that don't glow? Winter fireflies often appear during winter thaws. The beetles emerge from bark crevices and move about as the sun warms their dark bodies. They are fond of sweet sap flowing from freeze cracks or other tree-bark injuries, including maple taps. This attraction to sap explains why their common name is the sap-bucket beetle.
