Warner Community Power will begin serving Warner residents with low cost and flexibly sourced energy supply in March, managed by Community Power Coalition of NH which will purchase energy on our behalf, and CPCNH members. Residents without other fixed contracts or solar are automatically opted in. Energy users in Warner can see options and select which energy choice works best for them, including the % of renewables. Use the portal at www.communitypowernh.gov/warner or call 1-866-603-POWR 866-603-7697 to choose your power option, or to opt out, and have.your Eversource account number handy Default CPC rate is 8.1 cents at this time.
