You can **see options and select which energy choice works best** for you, including the % of renewables at the portal at www.communitypowernh.gov/warner or call 1-866-603-POWR or 866-603-7697 to choose your power option, or to opt out. Have your Eversource account number handy. The default CPC rate is 8.1 cents at this time. Eversource is 8.2 cents.

Sudden strong winds early on Thursday morning 2/29 brought down "some trees that never fell down before" and **Bean Road was temporarily blocked most of the day**, as those who have signed up for **Warner Alerts** system were handily notified. The alerts are used by Emergency Management to share important information. **Sign up for Warner Alerts** at <u>warnerNH.gov/keep-in-touch</u>. There is also a **Notices list** available which alerts people to postings on the website including new agendas and minutes.

Have you <u>signed up for NH Alerts</u> yet? If you have not signed up yet or would like to update your information go to <u>ReadyNH.gov</u> to enroll in the free NH Alerts emergency notification system. There is a new system this year, so previous users may have received an alert to update - these emails are NOT a scam.

In addition, individuals who use an app for NH Alerts will need to download the free **Genasys Protect** smartphone app to receive alerts (this changed after January 1).
