WOO HOO! We have reached the 1000 lb goal for the NexTREX stretchy plastic recycling challenge to earn a recycled plastic bench for Simonds School. Watch for a school celebration date in May when the recycled bench will be "unveiled". Thank you to everyone who participated by bringing the plastic to the library or School, and to Judy Pellettieri for collecting and weighing, and the School for collecting!

We would love to **pass this project along** to a local business or organization who might want to **take over collection to get a recycled bench of your own**. Please call the library for more information.603-456-2289.

Meanwhile, you can now **deposit your plastic film in the box inside Market Basket**'s entrance. We also encourage you to try to reduce the amount of plastic waste, by choosing **reusable bags, food containers, and items NOT wrapped in shrink wrap**. This makes a difference to the amount of trash the Town pays to have hauled away and incinerated, reducing pollution.



What else can you do?

Buy a **library tote bag** made of recycled cotton - roomy enough for LOTs of books, sports equipment, etc. Price: \$5 minimum donation.

Hydrant flushing will take place in the Village over the course of about 3 weeks, beginning on April 16, 2024. You may notice a decrease in water pressure or slight discoloration in your water at times during this period. Flushing of the hydrants is done two times a year, in May and November.

It's the Season!

Fun facts about Trillium flowers: Think hard before picking or destroying one!

- It takes 9 years after germination for a trillium to flower.
- Each flower yields only ONE seed pod each year.
- Each plant can live up to 25 years, and gains all of its nourishment for the remainder of the year during the spring when its leaves are present.
- Trillium are propagated by ANTS. Not bees, the wind, or birds. The seeds are covered by a sweet coating which entices the ants to carry seeds underground into their colonies. After eating the coating, the seed germinates in the perfect subterranean environment.
