Rethink, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repair

Reduce your taxes: Recycle! Warner Fees for solid waste disposal in 2023 (not including demolition waste and special disposal items) were \$76,091 (\$85/ton)!

Paper, corrugated cardboard and metals create income, so please don't put these, or glass or recyclable plastics in the compactor, which costs Warner \$\$ per ton and fills the landfill with unnecessary waste ash.

Yes, there is also a Swap Area at the Transfer Station, but please be considerate of what you drop there and how: employees should not have to sort, pick the trash out, or clear the area of small items, and weather may spoil some items.

Tips for mindful disposal and waste reduction:

Household goods can be dropped off at the Warner Historical Society for the Barn Sale, or taken to Goodwill. New London has a consignment store for furniture - or donate to the VNA resale store.

Offer or get items free on the <u>Buy Nothing Kearsarge (South) Facebook group</u>, or sell them on the <u>Kearsarge Area Online Yard Sale group</u>.

Sell at the **Davisville Flea Market** on Sundays May - Sept, or weekends all year at the **Kearsarge Indoor Flea Market** on **Kearsarge Mtn Rd**.

Stretchy plastic recycling:

The **United Church of Warner** has taken on the role of community partner in the ongoing TREX plastic collection project at Simonds School. **Stretchy plastics** may be dropped off **in the TREX box on the porch** of the Parish House next to the Church.

Acceptable items **stretch when you pull.** If it tears like paper, or is shiny or makes a crinkly/crunchy sound, do NOT recycle in the bins. https://nextrex.com/view/educate


