"Adventure Begins at your Library" is this year's theme. We all had a blast on an adventure at the river with Linden Rayton on Tuesday this week.



Outdoors, Fitness and Environment



Fun facts about **Tomato Hornworms:** these monstrous looking and annoying tomato pests transform into the stunning Five-spotted hawkmoth. This moth's long proboscis is perfectly designed to sip nectar from deep within flowers. As it feeds, it unintentionally collects pollen, which it then spreads from flower to flower, aiding in plant reproduction. This process is especially vital for **pollinating night-blooming flowers**.

Consider supporting them by relocating them to wild meadows instead of killing them, to support a future generation of beautiful and beneficial pollinators, which are facing challenges and need all the help they can get!

The easiest way to spot them: buy a UV flashlight and go out after dusk: they GLOW! You may find some of them looking mushy and covered in **parasitic wasp** eggs or larvae: don't destroy those, as they are a natural control.

Rethink, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repair

Reduce your taxes: Recycle! Warner Fees for solid waste disposal in 2023 (not including demolition waste and special disposal items) were \$76,091 (\$85/ton)! **Paper, corrugated cardboard and metals create income**, so please don't put these, or glass or recyclable plastics in the compactor, which costs Warner \$\$ per ton and fills the landfill with unnecessary waste ash.

Stretchy plastics may be dropped off **in the TREX box on the porch** of the Parish House next to the United Church of Warner for the Simonds School TREX bench project. Acceptable items **stretch when you pull.** If it tears like paper, or is shiny or makes a crinkly/crunchy sound, do NOT recycle in the bins. <u>https://nextrex.com/view/educate</u>
