
Rethink, Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repair

Rechargeable Battery Disposal Ban. Starting July 1, 2025, it will be illegal to put rechargeable lithium-ion batteries in the trash! They must be recycled through special battery collection programs. NEVER put them with your regular recyclables. Lithium-ion batteries can be found in electric bikes and scooters, cordless power tools, lawncare equipment, cell phones, laptops, tablets, wireless headphones, toys, and more. Learn more and find local recycling options by visiting the NHDES website.

In Warner, recycling earns \$\$ and reduces tipping costs, especially Metal, Aluminum, Mixed paper, corrugated cardboard, Plastics #1 and #2 (clear/green and laundry/milk). Bring to the Transfer Station. <u>https://learn.eartheasy.com/articles/plastics-by-the-numbers/</u>.




